I am sharing the below information on student programs and internships:

Bank of America Student Leaders Program

The Student Leaders program is an eight-week summer experience for high school juniors and seniors. The program includes a paid internship with a local nonprofit organization as well as the Student Leadership Summit in Washington, D.C. The program gives Student Leaders the opportunity to develop and apply leadership skills through hands-on community work experience while discovering their own talents for serving their community and leading others.

To become a Student Leader, you must:

- Currently be a junior or senior in high school
- Be legally authorized to work in the United States without sponsorship through the end of September 2025
- Be able to participate in an 8-week paid internship at a local nonprofit/charitable organization and work 35 hours a week
- Be able to participate in a week-long Student Leaders Summit in Washington, DC (July 21-26 2025)
 - Note: All expenses paid as part of the program and the week is counted within the 8-week experience
- Be a student in good standing at your school
- Permanently reside in one of the eligible locations

- Have not been previously selected for the program
 - Note: Students who applied in a previous year and were not selected can reapply if they meet other eligibility criteria
- Not be a Bank of America employee or immediate family member of a Bank of America employee (e.g., children, siblings, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, etc.)

Applications for the 2025 program are now being accepted through January 15th, 2025.

Ranger Conservation Corps

High school internship in conservation. Participants in The Ranger Conservation
Corps work with Urban Park Rangers on environmental restoration in parks. They also enjoy activities such as canoeing and overnight camping, and receive credit for community service hours. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Emma Bowen Foundation Summer Internship

Whether you're interested in being a producer, a journalist, a web developer, an engineer, a business executive, a PR agent, a sales representative, or any other career in media or tech, the Emma Bowen Foundation (EBF) is here to help you get your start. For over 30 years, EBF has been dedicated to the growth and development of students of color pursuing careers in media, entertainment, and technology.

You are eligible to apply for an EBF Summer Internship if you meet ALL of the following:

- Are a student of color (Asian, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Black, Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, Hispanic/Latino, or Multi-Racial)
- Are a high school senior OR an undergraduate college student (graduating Spring 2025 or later)
- Plan to attend or are currently a student at a four-year accredited U.S. college or university (This includes students who will transfer to a four-year accredited U.S. college or university in Spring 2025 or Fall 2025.)
- Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0
- Are interested in pursuing a career in media, entertainment, and tech
- Are able to commit to a summer internship that will last a minimum of 8
 continuous weeks and which could be longer as required by the company's
 internship duration. The internship is full-time and students work from 35-40
 hours per week as determined by the partner company. (Note: Internships
 generally start in May or June. The internship start and end dates are
 determined by the partner company.)
- Are a U.S. citizen or U.S. permanent resident
- Must be 18 years of age prior to the start of the internship

The AMMP Network is open to experienced media, entertainment, and technology professionals of color at college graduate/entry-level, mid, senior, and executive levels.

Biorocket Research Internship Program

The <u>Biorocket Research Internship Program</u> is a 6-month science research internship experience for New York City public and charter high school students age 16 and up.

The program provides students with the opportunity to learn the latest advances in genetic engineering and biology laboratory skills, along with the science communication skills necessary to communicate about these topics with a variety of audiences. By participating in the program, students have access to scientific mentors, behind-the-scenes lab tours and field trips, and improv training for science communication skills.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 16 years of age or older by orientation date.
- Live OR attend a NYC Public or Charter School within 45 minutes of Genspace*
- Commitment to participate in the program from February to August

*Some exceptions may be possible. Please apply anyway if you have a strong interest in participating in this program, even if you do not attend a school within 45 minutes of Genspace.

New York City Center - High School Externships

The New York City Center Externship Program introduces students and young adults (14–18) to the many career options available to them in the arts; focusing on creative, technical & design, and administrative arts jobs. While high school internships programs are a wonderful way to develop experience and skill building in specific departments, the externship's exposure model acts as a bridge program for those who are interested in the arts and curious about the viable career paths they offer.

Utilizing breaks in the NYC public school calendar (Midwinter Recess, Spring Break, Summer Vacation), each session offers in-depth, experiential seminars with City Center staff that explores the responsibilities and tasks for a variety of arts jobs with greater understanding of non-profit operations. Additionally, participants will receive invites to City Center productions & events.

Applications for the Creative Careers Session will open in November 2024.

Internships: College students - Graduates

Google Security Engineering Intern, BS/MS, Summer 2025

Please complete your application before November 22nd, 2024

<u>This internship</u> is intended for students in their penultimate academic year, who are pursuing a Bachelor's or Master's degree program in Computer Science, Information Security, or related technical field.

Minimum qualifications:

- Currently pursuing a Bachelor's or Master's degree in Computer Science, Information Security, or related technical field.
- Coding experience with one or more of the following: Python, Go, C++, JavaScript.
- Experience in one or more of the following: network protocols, secure network design, web application/browser security, authentication control, applied cryptography/security protocols, intrusion detection.

Preferred qualifications:

- Currently attending a degree program in the US and available to work full time for 12 weeks outside of university term time.
- In their penultimate academic year or returning to a degree program after completion of the internship.
- Understanding of technical privacy issues and experience with the software development lifecycle.
- Excellent communication skills.

The US base salary range for this full-time position is \$89,000-\$118,000.

Fellowship for applicants who received their bachelor's degree between Spring 2023 and Spring 2025

<u>The Urban Fellows Program</u> is a highly selective, nine-month fellowship which combines work in Mayoral offices and City agencies with volunteer service opportunities and a seminar series that explores current urban issues impacting public policy. Program participants are diverse and come from all over the country to work in New York City.

After participating in an extensive interview process, New York City Urban Fellows are placed at an array of agencies across the City where they learn about public policy through a hands-on approach.

The Fellows' work experience is supplemented by the seminar series, a unique learning experience that exposes Fellows to public and private sector leaders. Guest speakers, including senior level City officials and alumni, share their leadership experiences and their work on City initiatives.

The unique opportunity to work with current decision makers and assist in the implementation of public policy distinguishes the Urban Fellows Program as the premier training program in government. Alumni are consistently found in leadership positions throughout government, as well as the private and non-profit sectors.

The nine month Fellowship is expected to begin **September 2, 2025** and ends **May 8, 2026**. For their services, the program provides:

- A stipend of \$31,563
- Health Insurance coverage (not including dental or vision)

Please note: The Urban Fellows Program does not provide student loans, financial aid or scholarship for study. <u>Housing for participants is not included.</u>

The application period for the 2025-2026 Urban Fellows is now open - due date January 13, 2025
